This project has been designed by an engineer, and will distribute water from previously drilled wells.	On 09/05/2008, Chuck Rudolph, Project Manager of MG 64134, Denver Mile High Rotary, reported: We have been so near its completion for so long that I'm afraid I've deferred my updates. The water lines were all connected a couple of months ago. However, there was a problem that kept much flow from going to the furthest home sites. It was determined that either the central water tank had to be raised or a booster pump added. The contractor took the responsibility to make the correction by adding a booster pump. I was told last week that water is now flowing to all parts of the system. There was an overexpenditure for the system, that is being resolved among the Kenyan parties at present. Rotary's portion of the overexpenditure was \$1483. Rotary's part came about because the dollar eroded in value between the time we got the proforma invoice and the time the MG was funded. Supplemental funds have been provided by private parties and will be wired to our partner club this week. Karura-Nairobi Rotary (our partner) is making a visit to the project site this next week. This visit, hopefully, will provide the information needed to make my concluding report to TRF.

MINSAP is the arm of the Cuban government that approves all humanitarian medical donations and then will set up the transportation from Havana to destination. The first container for Guantanamo took about three weeks to clear and be delivered because there were no trucks available to move the container. We expect that this shipment will clear in the next week or so and we will be able to confirm the final delivery."

The long term goal is to provide teacher training for all grades, and to introduce a complete curriculum, one grade at a time annually.
