TRF advised on 5-1-06 that DDF Funds are exhausted, returning application. Hank contributed the money to make it happen. DENVER SENT ITS \$10,000 CHECK TO TRF ON 5-19-06 Project Cure working on packing list. Awaiting funding and customs work in China prior to shipping. We have the ambulance and supplies ready to ship but now the government is telling the hospital that after October 2008 all exemptions for the earthquake area expired. The doctor is researching how much the import taxes would be on the used vehicle. I have let Regula at the Beijing Rotary know the status also. If the head of the hospital can get the value of the vehicle reduced it may be worth paying the taxes. I have not heard back on the status in a week or so and will continue to follow up. China won't allow new imports of goods. Gone back to Partners to discuss next step.

The Himalayan Dental Relief Project brings dental volunteers overseas to provide first-time dental care to children in need. Treatment and preventive care is provided in seven-day camps, organized to serve children in orphanages, charity schools and remote villages. Ladakh is a harsh, remote region accessible by road only during the warmest months of the summer. The project would provide 3 new dental stations equipped with chairs, dental units, compressors and other required equipment. The time table is to have the equipment shipped to India for full camp expansion by may 2009.

The Buffalo Grove, IL RC has agreed to be a partner. The proposal has been approved by their District, 6440, which provides a 1.5:1 match. It is also been approved by Dist. 5450 and by RI, subject to compliance by the Delhi S RC with certain new Indian governmental requirements.
