CEBA SEEKS NOMINATIONS FOR 2010 ETHICS AWARDS

The Colorado Ethics in Business Alliance (CEBA) is accepting nominations for the 2010 CEBA Awards until Tuesday, Sept. 1. The awards recognize and celebrate organizations and individuals who exemplify excellence in ethics, including a commitment to sustainability within and without their organizations.

Nominations will be accepted in three categories: the Business Ethics Award for a Colorado business, The Daniel L. Ritchie Award for an individual, and the Samaritan Institute Award for a non-profit organization. Nominations may be submitted online at www.ceba.org, or call the CEBA office at 303-283-6002.

In the 18 years since CEBA began its award program, nearly 80 organizations and individuals have been honored. Next year's CEBA awards luncheon will be, March 18, 2010. The location has yet to be determined.

An independent volunteer committee, composed of former honorees, civic and volunteer leaders and University of Denver Daniels College of Business faculty, evaluates the nominees and selects a small group of finalists and, ultimately, individual honorees.

Organizational sponsors are the University of Denver Daniels College of Business, Samaritan Institute, Colorado Biz Magazine, Denver Rotary Club 31, other Rotary Clubs of Colorado, Denver/Boulder Better Business Bureau and Rocky Mountain Chapter of the Society of Financial Service Professionals.
